

How to create a Custom CPT/HCPCS/ICD-10 that can be billed to the patient's insurance.


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Should you need to bill a CPT/HCPCS/ICD-10 that is not available in DrChrono, you can add it manually.

- For **CPT** codes, you will need the code and its associated long, medium, and short descriptors.
- For **HCPCS** codes, you will need the code and its associated long, and short descriptors.
- For **ICD-10** codes, you will need the code and its name.

Once you have those pieces of information, you can add them by following the steps below:

1. Hover over **Billing** and select **Code Search** from the right column.
2. Press the green **+New** button on the right side of the screen.




