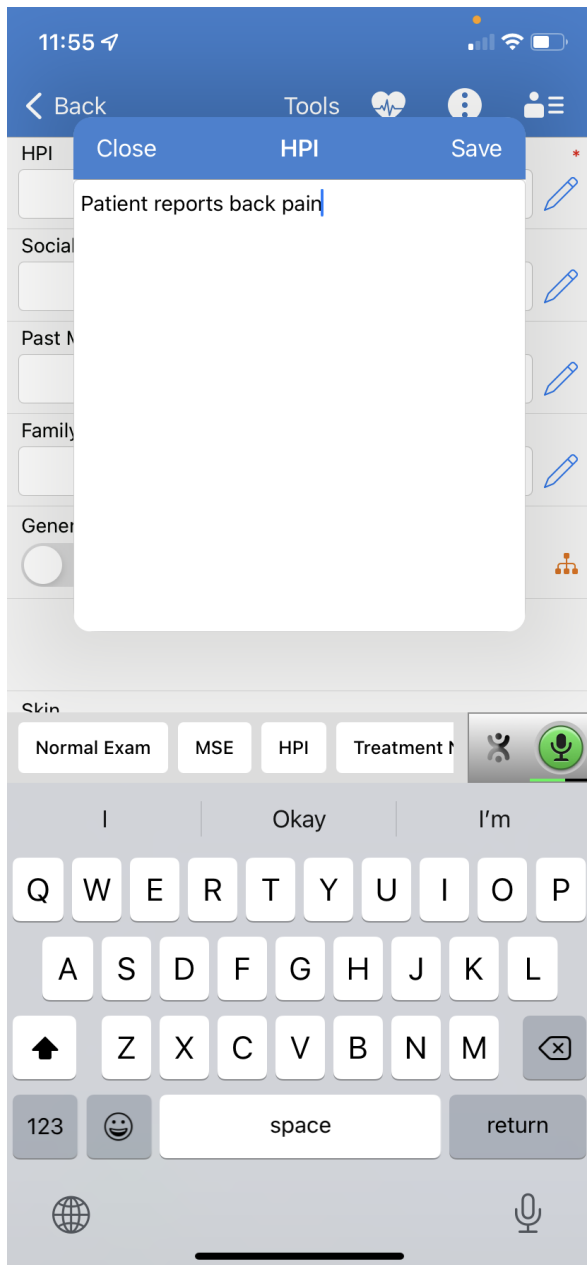


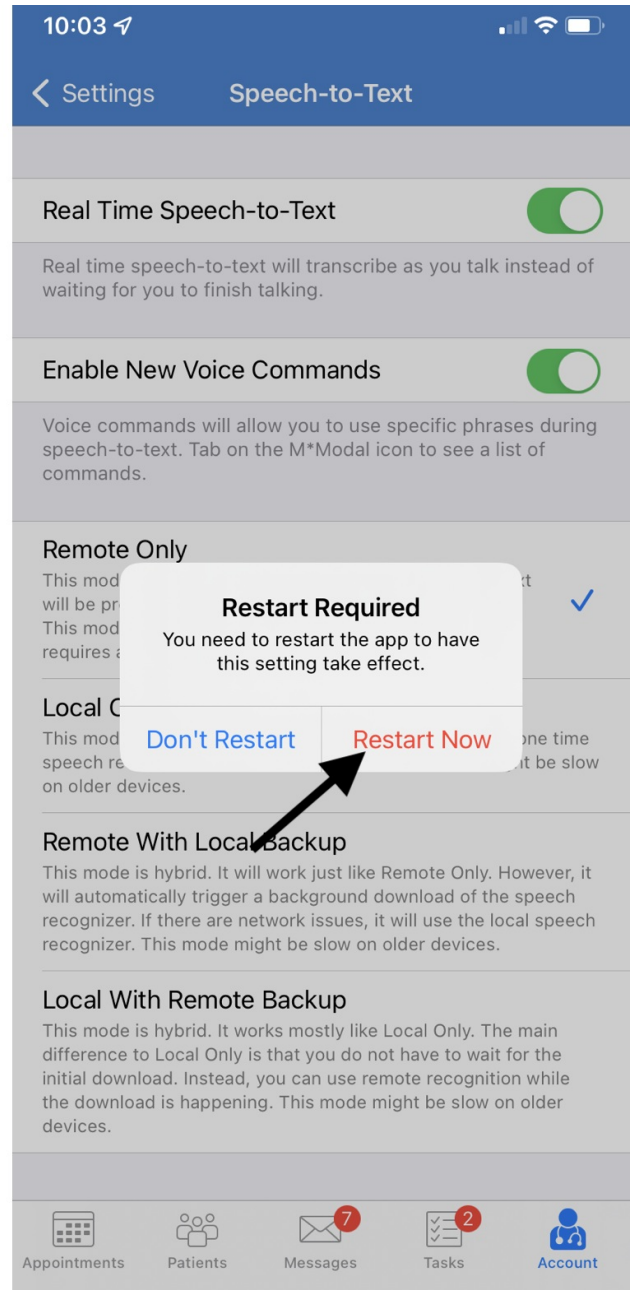
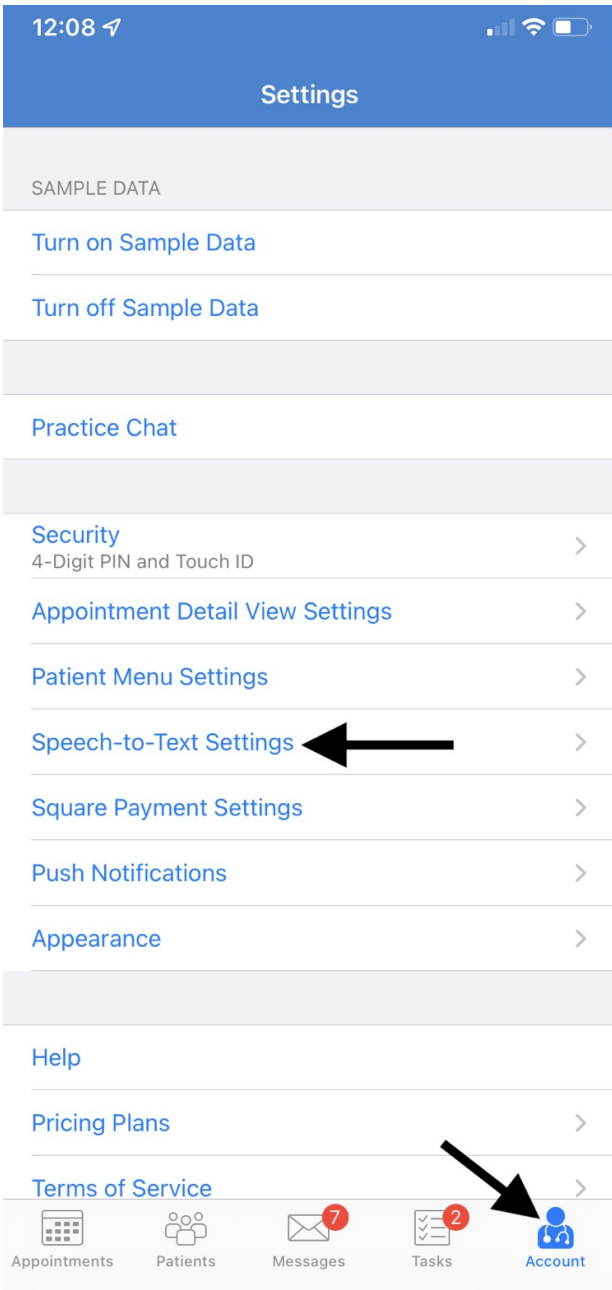
Using Voice Commands for Speech-to-Text on the iPhone

The Voice Commands functionality allows you to make edits to system documents by speaking, rather than by physically editing the text.



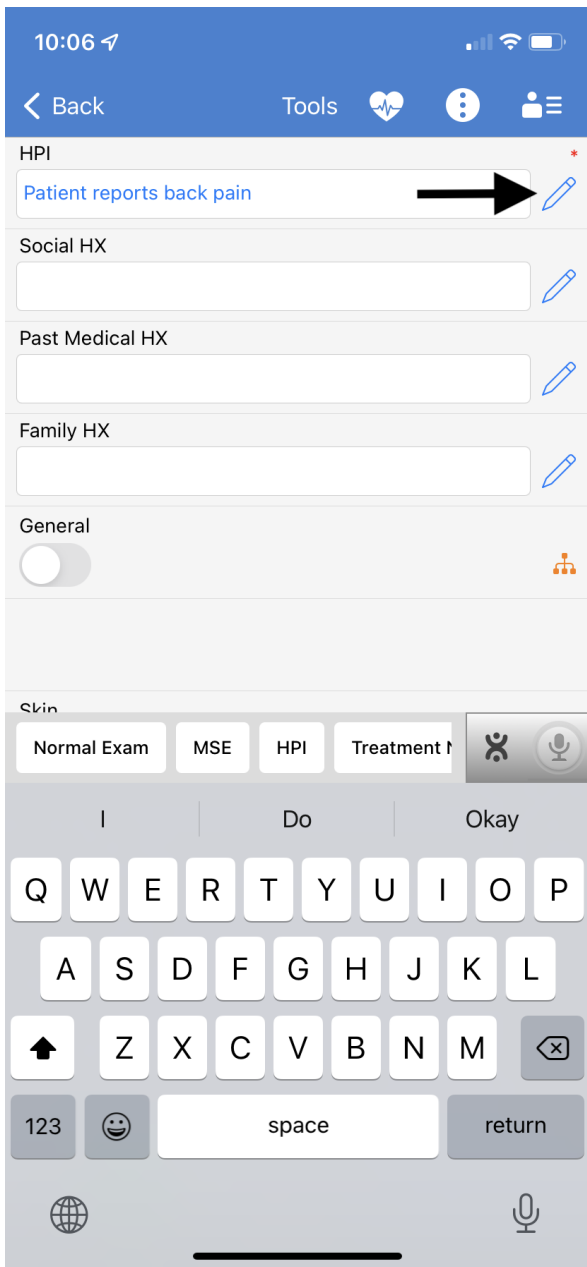
To access the Voice Commands functionality, click or tap **Speech-to-Text Settings** on the **Settings** screen. The following screen is displayed. The **Real-Time Speech-to-Text** option transcribes as you speak, rather than waiting until you are finished speaking to transcribe. The **Enable New Voice Commands** option allows you to use specific phrases. Tap **Restart Now** to enable.



Tap the pencil icon (



) to open the text field for dictation.



Tap on the M*Modal (



) icon to see a list of Voice Commands on the **What Can I Say?** screen, shown in the following illustration. You can use the commands to navigate the note while you dictate.
