

# Clinical Notes: Using the "Render H&P Physical Exam Text Before Vitals" Setting

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## What Is This Feature?

The "Render H&P Physical Exam Text Before Vitals" setting allows you to control the order in which physical examination text and vitals tables appear in your History & Physical (H&P) clinical note PDFs.

## Accessing the Setting

1. Navigate to Account Settings
2. Select the General tab
3. Scroll down to Clinical Notes
4. Check the "Render H&P Physical Exam Text Before Vitals" box

### Clinical Notes

Include Practice Official Name  Print practice official name in header. Name can be set in "Medical Billing" Tab

Include Business Logo  Top Center

Include Patient Chart Photo

Include Office Information  Include office name and address in the headers of clinical notes

Include Payer IDs  Include primary and secondary payer IDs in the headers of clinical notes

Include Lab Orders and Results  Show Lab Orders and Results in the plan section of clinical notes

Render H&P Physical Exam Text Before Vitals  Content text will appear before the vitals table in the Physical Exam section of clinical notes

## How It Works

### When Enabled (box is checked)

- The Physical Exam narrative text will appear first
- The vitals table will be displayed after the narrative content

### When Disabled (box is unchecked)

- The vitals table will appear immediately below the Physical Exam header
- Your narrative Physical Exam text will follow after the vitals table

## Choosing the Right Configuration

Consider enabling this setting if:

- Your physical exam notes provide context that helps interpret vitals
- You prefer a narrative flow that concludes with concrete measurements
- Your documentation workflow starts with observations and ends with metrics

Consider keeping this setting disabled if:

- You prefer to view measured vitals first before reading detailed observations
- Your team is accustomed to seeing vitals at the beginning of the Physical Exam section
- Your documentation workflow relies on referencing vitals while writing exam notes
