Enhanced allergy documentation

Your allergy records just got smarter. We've added new verification status options and standardized coding to ensure critical allergy information transfers seamlessly when you share records with other providers. Better documentation means better patient safety.

Document patient problems with greater precision using new status options (like "recurrence," "remission," and "relapse") and verification statuses. Plus, the system now automatically identifies Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) diagnoses, helping you paint a more complete picture of your patients' health needs.

Simplified new patient registration

New patient registration has been simplified by removing inline red warnings for additional fields. Only **First Name** and **Last Name** are now required, aligning the experience with web behavior and reducing unnecessary

interruptions during patient setup.

Resolutions

Use iPad EHR permission

We fixed an issue where changes to the **Use iPad EHR** permission were not consistently applied.

- The app now checks for permission changes **every 15 minutes**.
- If the **Use iPad EHR** permission is disabled, the user will be **automatically logged out** of the iPad EHR.
- Depending on timing, this may happen **immediately** or **within up to 15 minutes** after the change.

As part of this release, we are continuing our ongoing work to assess, monitor, and address any security vulnerabilities.
